A description of how the funds will be used to increase or improve services for foster youth, low-income students, and English learners to improve A-G eligibility

Funds will be used to allow students the opportunity to take A-G level courses through school affiliated educational partners such as Edgenuity, UC Scout, and BYU. This will improve their A-G eligibility because they can take a-g courses and CTE courses that the school current does not offer.

A description of the extent to which all students, including foster youth, low-income students, and English learners, will have access to A-G courses approved by the University of California.

All students are encouraged to enroll in A-G courses in order to meet expectations for College and Career Readiness. Tutoring, personal technology (Chromebooks), school and home internet access, and language support are available to support all students.

The number of students who were identified for opportunities to retake A-G approved courses in which they received a “D”, “F”, or “Fail” grade in the 2020 spring semester or the 2020-21 school year and a description of the method used to offer the opportunity retake courses.

Number of Students: 8

JCS-LIVE had 8 students who earned a D in a-g courses. All of these students were given the opportunities to retake the course for a higher grade during summer session or during the 2021-2022 school year.

21-22 LCAP Goal #3 is a focus goal to to prepare students for the world of work. In Spring 2020 32% of high school students met a-g requirements and 0% completed CTE pathways although the majority of our high school students completed CTE courses online. For the next two years we will only focus a desired outcome for these two areas, although we will continue to measure AP, and a-g requirements as well.
