






MWEA MAP Fall to Winter Growth (Reading)



- Reading growth is above average: Median growth is at the 58th percentile, with nearly 46% of students above the 61st percentile, indicating strong overall progress.
- Achievement improved meaningfully from Fall to Winter: Median achievement rose from the 51st percentile (Fall) to the 59th percentile (Winter), with more students moving into higher performance bands.
- Large cohort supports confidence in trends: With 276 students, the data reflects a consistent, schoolwide improvement in reading outcomes.


NWEA MAP Fall to Winter Growth (Math)



- Math growth is above average overall: Median growth is at the 57th percentile, with nearly 46% of students above the 61st percentile, indicating solid progress across grades.
- Achievement improved from Fall to Winter: Median achievement increased from the 46th percentile (Fall) to the 51st percentile (Winter), showing modest gains in overall proficiency.
- Large, stable population: With 314 students, the trends reflect a reliable, schoolwide pattern—steady growth paired with gradual improvement in achievement.
